After loosing the war for freedom and free democracy in Cambodia on the 17th, April 1975 to Communist Khmer Rouge of Killing Fields and Communist Monarchy collaborators the first refugee groups arrived in California that made up the most of Khmer Republic Military of Army, Air Force, and Navy, their children, and families; Students who lived abroad and studied in the U.S.; Civil services; and some Business people. The United States Government brought them to Camp Pendleton, California as refugees. Most of them found their sponsors in Southern California and established their new lives ever since.
